## **Equine Assisted Services--Therapy-Learning-Horsemanship**

Did you notice? At the top of this newsletter is our new logo showing that our services are not just therapeutic riding, but equine assisted services – therapy, learning and horsemanship. WCR will continue to offer horsemanship skills in the riding program and equine assisted learning for education (e.g. a school IEP) and personal development.

And now we are excited to expand our services to offer equine facilitated psychotherapy and counseling! This program is a mostly ground-based program where the participant, working with a licensed/certified professional team and our horses, work to provide healing opportunities for things like depression, substance abuse, trauma and relationships. With the departure of our previous partner, Honey Creek Counseling, we are able to continue this program with its former team as a WCR offering.

Our therapy horses are essential to what we offer – interaction with amazing horses for children and adults with special needs and mental health concerns. Each horse can cost between \$1590 and \$2900 to annually support their care and health needs – things like hay, grain, and supplements; farrier, dental and veterinary services; vaccines; fly spray; grooming products; and pasture/shelter upkeep.

#### Big Ass Fans - Help Needed for Installation and Electrical

Because of YOU and your generosity, we exceeded our Giving Tuesday goal of \$5,000 to provide two Big Ass Fans for our indoor arena! Thank you -Now our indoor arena will be more comfortable for participants and horses with improved air circulation, cooling in summer and creating a breeze to deter pesky flies from bothering our horses and participants.

The next step is installation and electrical. WCR is looking for use of a mechanical lift to reach the 14' ceiling height to install the fans and their steel frame to the trusses and an electrician to run the wiring to each fan to power them up! ### **Quick Updates**

## Watch for more news on the following activities at WCR.

- . **Program Horses** March conditioning. As our new riding season approaches, we need to prepare our horse partners for their program work. This is a conditioning program to exercise, groom, train/re-train the horses <u>Volunteers needed to work with the horses</u>. No experience is necessary. Contact WCR if you are interested.
- . The 2021 Horsemanship **lesson schedule** has been established. New this year is 4-week sessions (rather than the former 6-week sessions). We felt this would better accommodate our riders' schedules of school and vacations. <u>Sessions begin April 5.</u> Forms and complete schedule listing will be available soon.
- . **Volunteers** are always welcome to be a part of WCR. No experience needed for our programs we gladly offer training for whatever part of our programs may interest you.

**Current Volunteer Needs**: winter chores (grooming, blanketing, cleaning horse shelters); spring horse conditioning (horse exercise and training); horsemanship program volunteers (helping during lessons as groomer, sidewalker and horse leader).



<u>Available for Horse Sponsorship: RUSTY</u> came to Willow Creek Ranch in July 2019 with some serious health concerns. He did not come with a lot of information on his past, he may have been a 4H project and trail horse. He ended up at an auction and was not sold. He was put in a holding pen

when a man approached the fence and Rusty came to greet him. Luckily it was that "rescue" that led him to WCR rather than an unhappy end. Months of special care and feeding to make him healthy created an exceptional horse that has brought a lot of joy and fun to WCR (and some funny stories-like walking into the Community Room to look out the window!). He has been working in the riding lesson and mental health programs and has become a favorite friend to many of our volunteers and riders. Birth date unknown, estimated 20 years old, American Quarter Horse.
