

Indoor Arena Update, Town of Waterford Meetings:

Don Harvey, WCR Volunteer Project Manager, and Brian Murphy, WCR volunteer, and Jennifer Pape will attend the Town of Waterford Planning Commission Meeting on Monday, April 2, at 5:30pm and the Town of Waterford Board Meeting on Monday, April 9, at 5:30pm to present the building proposal for the 40'x30' storage addition onto the existing pole barn and a 72'x120'x14' indoor riding arena.

Outdoor Riding Arena has Trucking Needs!

WCR received a permit from Racine County Zoning Dept., and the Town of Waterford has given permission to remove 4-6" of topsoil from the outdoor riding arena. A local rock quarry is donating sand and gravel material for the arena footing. Imagine an outdoor riding arena with sand! **How Can YOU Help?** WCR is in need of a small bull dozer to remove the top soil and several dump trucks (prefer 5 yard) to haul and move the material to the outdoor arena site.
