Indoor Riding Arena, progress report

The concrete has been poured in the arena entryway and the community room. Plumbing has been installed and is ready for the community room, bathroom and kitchen areas. Electrical connections are next to do.

Thank you to our donors who have provided funds to continue on this indoor arena and community room building project. The community room will have an ADA compliant bathroom, a kitchen area, a viewing room for parents and guests to watch lessons, and a meeting room.

Next steps are to prepare the walls in the community room-insulation, install the walls and build the bathroom. Please continue to support this project with a gift to our building fund and/or providing materials such as 2x4 interior building grade lumber, flooring, tile, kitchen cabinets/sink, new ADA compliant grab bars, toilet or bathroom sink. Then we will be adding the heating system, installing flooring and doing finishing carpentry.
