# Indoor Riding Arena, progress report

The indoor arena sand base footing has been completed and crushed rubber was added! A special thank you to Axel Knauz, Grayslake, IL, for the donation of 110 yards of custom blended Nike shoe sole crushed rubber. The surface will provide cushion, rebound, and grip to minimize concussion, absorb shock, and provide support to our program horses, riding instructors, and volunteers. The custom blend mixture of textiles, fibers, and rubber mixed with pea gravel and sand will retain moisture to reduce dust and be low maintenance. And thank you to **Chris Hotz** for donating the use of his Dump 'N Go trailer and **Mark Krupp** for making the 100 mile round trek back and forth to haul the rubber product to the Ranch!

The interior arena walls have been installed with 2'x6' oak boards to prevent the horse from kicking through the steel. A 10'x10' and a 10'x14' stall have been built to provide space to brush and groom the horses prior to their riding lessons.

With gratitude to our community of supporters, we are pleased to be able to move to the next phase of plumbing, electric, and concrete! Snow, wind, and rain did not stop Dairyland Energy Solutions from starting the interior plumbing project on October 31. We expect electrical to begin the first part of November, just in time for McPherson Concrete to pour concrete in the new commons area and the entry area in the indoor arena.

We are able to continue the work on the indoor arena because of generous donors and supporters like you. In addition, a significant donation came Hally and Walter Barr with a matching gift from the Chicago firm of William Blair
