Indoor Riding Arena progress report



Thank you to our donors during our #GivingTuesday campaign and Fall/Winter solicitation mailing. The lumber for the interior walls was purchased and the walls and ceilings are up in the community room, ADA bathroom and tack room. None of this would be possible without the help of many volunteer carpenters who braved the December-February elements: Mark, Brian, Chuck, Mike C., Jim, Ryan, Noah, Mike S., Dewey, and Lenny. The wall framing is up in the community room and bathroom, interior door installed for the bathroom, and tack room walls completed – including a really amazing hand-built Dutch door. And we have heat in the community room! Dairyland Energy Solutions has installed an electrical panel, put in outlets and light switches, hung the arena lights, and installed exit signs and outdoor lighting fixtures. Devix Heating and Cooling has installed the HVAC for heating.

Thank you for the donation of time from **Tom and Nick Pointek** (volunteer Joy's husband and son), for coordinating Toby Rott and two crew members of De Luca & Tobin Cable Contractors, Ltd. to string the electrical wiring for the indoor arena lights!

Thank you to Diversified Insulation for adding insulation to the community room and tack room walls and ceilings – a good portion of it was generously donated by owner **Mike Voss**.

Next steps are to add interior wall panels and finishing carpentry work. We are excited to welcome new horse Tucker. Tucker is 18 years old and WCR's first paint horse! You will recognize him by his splashes of white on his stomach, hips and up his legs. Tucker is a leased horse from Jennifer's aunt Melissa in Iowa. Tucker was part of Melissa's family for the past 10 years, mostly as a trail horse. He was shown at the Clayton County fair as a 4H project in pleasuring showing and speed games, was a trail horse, and family companion. Tucker was in parades, rodeos, and for several years carried Mary, mother of Jesus, in the Las Posodas re-enactment at St. Mary's school.

2020 Horsemanship Schedule - Registration

We are happy to announce that our 2020 therapeutic riding and horsemanship schedule has been set! Both evening group lessons (Mondays through Wednesdays) and daytime private and independent rider lessons (Tuesdays through Thursdays) are available. Each lesson is 45 therapeutic minutes. Therapeutic minutes are defined as interaction time that serves the purpose of improving the learning and growth of a rider, with horseback riding time a part of those therapeutic minutes. Lessons also may include ground work, grooming or learning about the horse.

Lesson fees are the same as last year. No fee increases! Our participant fees represent only about 30% of what it actually costs to provide each client with the benefits of therapeutic riding. We are grateful for donations and sponsorships that help with most of the other 70% of lessons costs. Additional fundraising will also benefit our programs.

2020 Lesson Schedule

Session 1: 6 weeks, March 23 - May 1

(No class on Monday, May 25, Memorial Day. Make up lesson will be available.)

Session 2: 6 weeks, May 4 - June 12

Session 3: 6 weeks, June 15 - July 24

Session 4: 6 weeks, July 27 -September 4

Ranch Rodeo tentatively set for Saturday, August 8

WCR will be closed September 7 – 11 (Labor Day week/back to school)

Session 5: 6 weeks, September 14 – October 23

Session 6: 6 weeks, October 26 - December 4

(Fall/winter daytime and evening lessons depending on volunteer availability and weather)
